Community Learning Center Schools, Inc is committed to teaching, modeling and enforcing high standards of conduct and will assign consequences for misbehavior in order to foster the lifeskills of Trustworthiness, Respect, Responsibility, Caring, and Citizenship, and to ensure that schools are safe, healthy, learning environments for all learners.

The following chart indicates the types of disciplinary action that may apply to each type of misbehavior infraction. In each instance, an opportunity to teach appropriate behavior through the use of intervention and a restorative action is implied. Each situation or violation involving learner conduct should be individualized. The administration shall, however, determine whether a specific infraction warrants the corrective action described on the chart. Administration can call for a higher level of consequence based on the circumstances of the event, number of infractions within one event, and past actions with the overall safety of the school in mind. Corrective action taken by the administration shall take place after progressive discipline interventions by the school fail to bring about the proper conduct. These corrective measures are intended to assist in teaching appropriateness and responsibility, while maintaining consistent student discipline on campus.

Key Code for Learners

Based on the severity or persistent nature, consequences may lead to more severe consequences at the discretion of the school administration.

**If the school does not offer On-Campus Suspension (OCS) a consequence of comparable value at the administration's discretion will be offered.

Indicates law enforcement MUST be notified pursuant to EC 48902, PC 245, PC 626.9, or PC 626.10.

Referral to Community-Based Services

After ten days of suspension, a multi- disciplinary team (e.g. SST) must be held to attempt to correct and improve the learner's behavior, attendance, and/or academic performance.

After fifteen days of suspension, a multi-disciplinary district team (e.g. SBRT) must be held to attempt to correct and improve the learner's behavior, attendance, and/or academic performance

- c) Causing a learner to experience substantial interference with his/her academic performance
- d) Causing a learner to experience substantial interference with his/her ability to participate in or benefit from the services, activities or privileges provided by a school.

Ed Code 48900 (r)(2) Cyber Bullying (513)

These laws do not apply to learners after they have reached their destination away from school or school activities. EC 48900 (s)
